



The Fate of Pythius


Pythius the Lydian offered 4,000,000 gold staters to the war effort, asking only that his eldest son remain home.




The Pan-Hellenic alliance was fragile. Athens and Sparta stood almost alone against the world.

- **Greek Alliance:** 300 Spartans, Thebans, Thespians, Phocians.


THE VIGNETTE

Remaining: 300 Spartans, Thespians, Thebans, Thebans.




The Prophecy
